As KORA Vice President, I made remarks in the absence of KORA President Rollin Conway at the April 18 meeting of the KORA Council.

I somewhat facetiously commented on the “to do” list Rollin provided before he went off for his heart valve surgery, listing what needed to be accomplished in the following 14 days before the Council meeting. There were 23 items on the list, and while that may sound onerous, it was all quite straightforward.

My remarks were perhaps too light. First, without the help that other members of Council, various residents, and staff all cheerfully provided, the meeting might not have run as well as it did. Second, I have come to learn that beyond accomplishing the “to do” tasks, while important, there are other affairs and responsibilities involved in presiding over KORA – items that Rollin hadn’t put on the list but that I became aware of in my role as backup president. My new awareness makes me realize the really important contributions to the life of our Kendal community that KORA, its officers and counselors, and you, its members, make. Our residents’ association is active and it is important in our life in this community.

The KORA Council meetings may seem rather pro forma, but the background collection of information and the thought and discussion that precede these meetings is extensive, and the results are worth paying attention to. We residents play a critical role in the way in which we live our lives here. Our ideas, thoughts, and deliberations are important. Keep them coming!

It takes time to process requests with pharmacies and we never want you to run out of medication. Please notify the Health & Wellness Clinic **at least five business days** in advance when you need a new prescription written and processed.

You can call the Health & Wellness Clinic at 440-775-9819 to provide us with the prescription request information or you can complete the request form located at the entrance to the Health & Wellness Clinic.

Please be sure you give us the medication name, the proper dosage, the number of pills remaining, and which pharmacy you would like to use.

## Holocaust Remembrance Day Sun., May 5 - 4:30 pm Warner Concert Hall (Carpool)

This free program features speakers including Holocaust survivor Carol Wilner, a performance of songs by soprano and Oberlin Conservatory alumna Emily Mandell '23 with pianist Thomas Bandy, and a performance of *Gideon Klein's String Trio* by Oberlin Conservatory String Department faculty violinist Sibbi Bernhardsson, violist Kirsten Docter, and cellist Dmitry Kouzov.

Klein wrote this piece in Terezín ten days before he was moved to Auschwitz. He perished at the sub-camp of Fürstengrube in 1944. Bernhardsson will perform on one of the violins from the Violins of Hope collection. Three additional violins from the collection will be on display in the Conservatory.

Ammon Weinstein, the renowned Israeli master violin maker, is the restorer responsible for the discovery and repair of these violins. His vision was to restore violins that survived the concentration camps and ghettos of World War II, even when their owners often did not. He received an Anne Frank Special Recognition Award for his efforts.

## Springtime and Sidewalks

Spring is finally here! This is a perfect time to take a look at what is outside your front door and on your sidewalks. Ask yourself these questions:

### 1. Is my area clear?

- Can emergency personnel and their equipment get through safely while moving at a fast pace to get to me or to a neighbor?
- Are there any items that stick out (obstruct), creating a trip hazard to others walking by? Keep in mind that some of us use devices and have vision impairments.
- Can carts (especially Housekeeping Carts) be maneuvered around corners without my belongings blocking their way?

### 2. Is my area welcoming? Do neighbors and others walking by appreciate what they see?

- Are my plants/flower pots healthy and maintained or is it time to discard/replace?
- Is my own personal trash cleaned up?
- Am I really using every item I have placed out here?
- Is this what I want everyone to see outside my home, making Kendal look the best it can be?

Please take time to observe more closely the walks near your cottage. I will be checking all sidewalk areas in May, hoping we can all work together to maintain our sidewalks for safe clearance and orderly presentation.

## Yes, KaO Does Have a Safety Committee!



**History:** KORA originally had a Resident Safety Committee led by the late Bob Coan. Gradually membership dwindled until there was just Bob. By that time, in 2003, KaO had joined the newly formed Peace Church Risk Retention Group and established a required risk management program with the goal of involving our residents in safety efforts to keep our community's risk events as low as possible. We already had a Staff Safety Committee, and the suggestion was made in 2005 to open that committee to resident membership.

**Resident members** have included Bob Coan, Dave Evans, Thelma Morris, Barbara Bruer (continuing), Diantha Paré, Ron and Chris Price (continuing), Marilyn Burns, and Rebecca Cardozo (continuing). Note: The combined Safety Committee is not a KORA Committee and receives no funds from KORA.

**Staff members** represent Hospitality, Facility, Health Services, and Administration. They perform monthly safety audits throughout the Community Center, Apartment Building, and Facility Services Buildings. This committee is responsible for adhering to the Life Safety standards of the Ohio Department of Health.

**The Safety Committee** is very active, and responsible for monitoring the environmental safety conditions of our KaO community within and without our buildings on campus. (Remember the Clutter Presentation last fall at the Afternoon Exchange.) When appropriate, articles are published in the *Kendalight* (resident) and *Ripples in the Pond* (staff) newsletters advising of safety concerns observed by or reported to Safety Committee members. Currently the Committee meets every fourth Monday (exceptions dependent on Memorial Day and Christmas Day dates) year-round at 1:00pm in the Green Room.

The Horticulture Committee will have indoor and outdoor plants on sale on tables in the Heiser West Corridor (from the mailboxes to the bank).

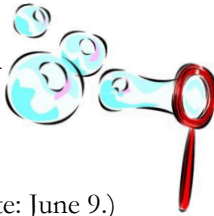
We will have more geraniums this year and a variety of houseplants and vegetable plants to choose from. Some bulbs and root plants from the Courtyard Garden will be available for sale.

**Spring Books on the New Bookshelf**

- *Table for Two* by Amor Towles. The new book by the author of *The Lincoln Highway* and other popular novels features six short stories as well as a novella, *Eve in Hollywood*.
- *The Hunter* by Tana French. In a sequel to *The Searcher* published in 2020, a former cop from Chicago moves to a small village west of Ireland. His longed-for peace is disturbed by the arrival of two men bent on finding gold.

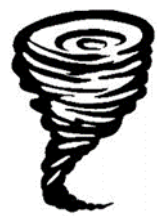
### Get Ready for the Parade!

## Are You Ready for Severe Weather?

Ohio has already had more tornadoes (39) than any other state. To date Kendal has been spared, but there is more to come. I highly recommend that everyone obtain a battery-operated weather radio tuned to the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration (NOAA) channel during the severe weather season. For hearing-impaired friends, there are weather radios that will vibrate and show warning messages on a screen.

When severe storms are predicted, monitor your weather radios, computers, and TV weather channels to stay updated on the latest storm advisories. Now is the time to check your battery supply to assure you have flashlights loaded with fresh batteries and replacements in case of power failures due to storms. Start monitoring the weather when a Severe Storm Watch is announced.

Kendal has a Safety Plan and Procedure that residents and staff must follow to avoid injury in the event of severe weather warnings. **Our shelter areas are:**

**Heiser Community Center:** Public restrooms, Heiser Auditorium, and interior corridors away from windows.

**Apartment Building:** Bathrooms (if no windows), laundry rooms, trash rooms, stairwells, and corridors away from windows. If time permits, second-floor residents should go to the lower level of the building and take shelter in the above-mentioned areas – always away from windows.

**Stephens Care Center:** Public restrooms, bathing rooms, interior corridors, and resident bathrooms away from windows.

**Cottages:** Bathrooms and closets inside, away from windows.

When the National Weather Service issues a Tornado or Severe Thunderstorm Warning for Lorain County, all staff members and residents should respond immediately by taking precautions and seeking safe shelter.

Facility Services and Stephens Care Center have weather radios that issue watches, warnings, and advisory announcements. They will communicate with the rest of the community center. During the day, Facility Services will notify the Heiser Community Center of imminent severe weather.

**Oberlin City's and Kendal's tornado warning sirens will activate only when Oberlin is in the direct path of an approaching tornado. Do not depend on hearing this siren to take shelter. Instead monitor the weather advisories when severe weather is anticipated; tornadoes can strike within minutes.**

## From the John Bartram Arboretum Street Trees at the Phase 2 Roadway

More than a decade ago, a row of elm trees were planted at the Phase 2 roadway. At the time, many people thought this type of elm could survive a disease spread by a bark beetle. This was not to be the case. Sadly, the trees have now succumbed to the disease.

Nowadays, botanists and arborists recommend against planting only one variety of tree in a row as street trees. Instead, they suggest alternating about three varieties to reduce the likelihood that so many trees will die about the same time.

As a result, the plan this year at the Bartram Arboretum Phase 2 Roadway is to alternate sugar maple, bur oak, and persimmon. An outside contractor will do this planting to give our grounds crew the labor time to plant other trees on campus. Our arborist has already

chosen specific healthy trees:

- 5 oaks (*Quercus macrocarpa*)
- 4 sugar maples (*Acer saccharum*) ‘Fall Fiesta’
- 4 Persimmons (*Diospyros Virginians*).

The persimmon is dioecious, meaning it has separate male trees and female trees. The persimmon trees selected are straight species (not cultivars) and unseeded. We won’t know how many of them will produce fruit until they bloom (which they should be old enough to do at planting).

Do keep your eyes on the Phase 2 roadway to see how beautifully this develops.

## Nest Box News

Only one of Kendal’s 16 nest boxes is active. It contains the nest of Eastern Bluebirds and as of this writing has five newly hatched bluebird chicks. As you walk the perimeter path, you can watch the adults going in and out to feed the hungry brood. The box is identifiable by the shiny mylar streamers fluttering above it. These are “sparrow spookers” to help deter predation by English House Sparrows which are known to enter nest boxes to destroy eggs and kill the adult sitting on the nest and the chicks. Spookers are mounted on boxes with active nests of native American cavity-dependent birds.

American Tree Swallows are checking out boxes at Farmer Pond, Island Pond, Meadow Pond, the grove of trees near Lot 5, and boxes all along Wildflower Hill and at Rock Pond, but there are no additional nests yet. That is just as well! There are not yet many mosquitoes or other insects in the air for them to catch on the fly.
